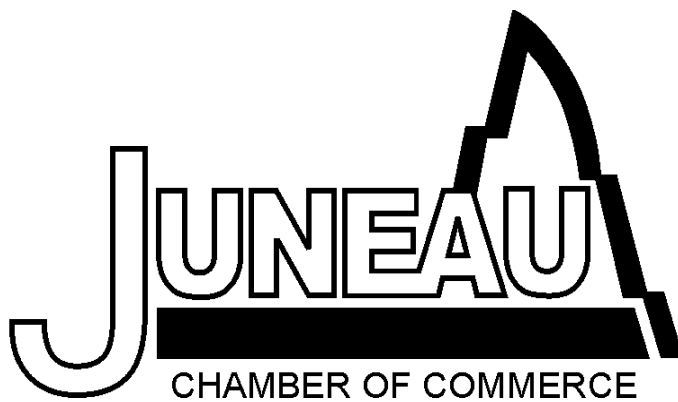

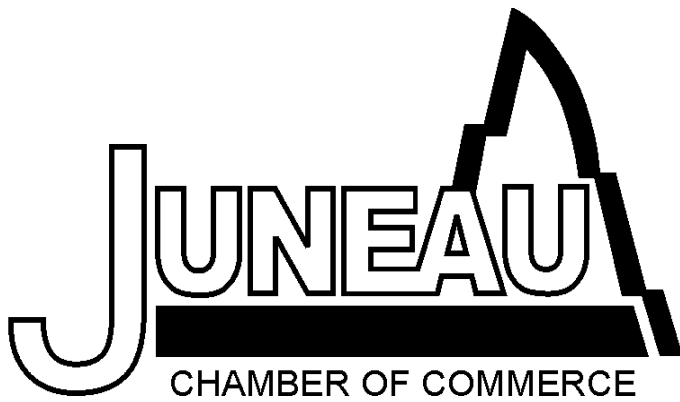

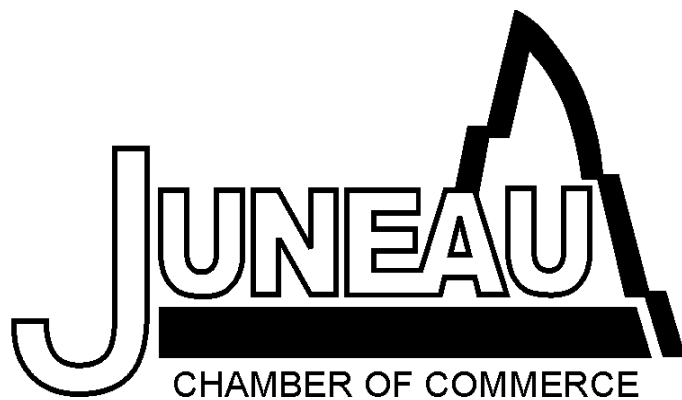

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# **A VISITOR'S INTRODUCTION TO HIKING IN THE JUNEAU AREA**

*The water and mountains surround Juneau. Marine life, birds and wildlife are abundant, as are opportunities to enjoy the outdoors.*

If you are planning a long visit or several hikes, you may want to purchase the "Juneau Trails" booklet published by the Alaska Natural History Association and the USDA Forest Service. The booklet includes trail descriptions and topographical maps for 29 trails in the Juneau area. These trails vary in length from .5 to 12 miles (one way) and provide many different experiences including rain forest, mountain and glacier view, remnants of the gold mining era and occasional wildlife glimpses. Many of these trails do require a car, as the trailheads are located beyond the city bus line. Trail books and maps are available at the US Forest Services, 907-586-8800 and local bookstores.

## **General Hiking Information**

Hikers should be prepared for Juneau's generally wet and cool weather. Waterproof hiking boots are recommended. If you are planning to hike alone, it is recommended that you let someone know your plans, and when you expect to return. "The Bears and You" is a useful brochure produced by the Alaska Department of Fish & Game and available at USFS visitor centers. Look

for the booklet “Outdoor Ethics & Trail Etiquette” by the Trail Mix, a non-profit organization, for more tips. While encounters with bears are rare, it definitely helps to know how to handle the possibility. Hikers walking the beaches should know the day’s tide range. Some winter guided hikes are organized by Juneau Parks & Recreation (907-586-5226) and Gastineau Guiding (907-586-2666).

## **Trails/Walks from the Downtown Area**

**Mt. Roberts Trail-** (4.5 miles to summit, 3,819’ elevation). The trail begins up a stairway at the end of 6<sup>th</sup> Street, above downtown Juneau (see Juneau Map). A 15-minute steep walk provides a great overlook view of Juneau. The first 2 miles of Mr. Roberts Trail are forested. Beyond, hikers are rewarded with spectacular views on sunny and even not to sunny days. The trail is rated as more difficult and climbs from the bottom to the summit. During summer a tramway reaches the 2000-foot level.

**Basin Road & Perseverance Trail-** Follow Basin Road, above downtown (see Juneau Map) until the road ends at the cul de sac, where Perseverance Trail begins (trail head is approximately 2-1/2 miles from downtown waterfront). A walk along Basin Road provides views of Silverbow Basin and Gold Creek and the remains of building and machinery belonging to the Alaska-Juneau Gold Mine. Perseverance Trail is a lovely, relatively flat, valley trail that is 3 miles one way.

## **Other Hiking Trails**

**The Dan Moller Trail**, on Douglas Island, is rated as easy, with a one-way distance of 3 miles and an elevation gain of 1,800 ft. It affords good views and wildflowers in season. The trailhead is located a short distance from downtown Juneau off Pioneer St. Take a left, and you’ll see the trail sign by the 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> house. Boards & planking along the way is slippery when wet.

The **Douglas Island Treadwell Historic Trail at Sandy Beach** is very interesting. The map, which describes mining ruins along the trail, is available at the City Museum (24 cents). It is very important to stay on trail. The entire area is honeycombed with tunnels, pits and other diggings from mining days.

The **Spaulding Trail**, with a one-way length of 3 miles and an elevation gain of 1,800 ft., is rated more difficult. Large, sub alpine, muskeg meadows and good views reward the hiker. The trailhead is located on Glacier Hwy. It is approximately 13 miles from downtown.

The **West Glacier Trail** is considered more difficult. With a one-way distance of 3.4 miles, and an elevation of 1,300 ft. it is the best trail for viewing the Mendenhall Glacier and ice fields beyond. The trail starts about 2 miles from the closest bus stop. Take the Montana Creek Road exit off the parking lot at the end of the road. NOTE: The **West Glacier Trail** is not accessible from the Mendenhall Glacier Visitor Center.

The Mendenhall Glacier Visitor Center is the starting point for the **East Glacier and Nugget Creek Trails**. The East Glacier Trail winds 3.5 miles one way through dense vegetation and gains 400 ft. The trail also affords good views of the Mendenhall Glacier. The Nugget Creek Trail connects ¼ miles in and climbs moderately for 4 miles one way. Mining related ruins could be viewed. The Mendenhall Glacier Visitors Center is located at the end of Mendenhall Rd.

**Auke Lake Trail** right off Glacier Highway circumnavigates Auke Lake. This lovely and easy woods walk along the lakeshore is home to tall trees, beaver, otter, squirrels, fish, waterfowl, and bird life.

The **Mendenhall Wetlands/Dike Trail** trail is one of the old roadbeds servicing the old dairy farm and the emergency vehicle road used by the Juneau International Airport. The Mendenhall Wetlands is immediately adjacent to the Airport, accessible off Ratcliffe Road. The area overlooks the wetlands between the mainland and Douglas Island and is a bird watcher's paradise. Canada Geese, ducks, songbirds, and seabirds abound. Some educational signs have been placed on the trail relating to the birds, wildlife and ecology of the area.

Herbert Glacier Trail: This trail head is one of three at approximately 28 mile Glacier Highway, the others are Windfall Lake and Eagle Glacier trails.

The entire trail is relatively flat with scenic views along Herbert River. The terrain and grounds gradually change, as you get closer to the glacier. Tall forests become alder and smaller vegetation. Eventually you break into the vast moraine of the glacier.

**Mt. Juneau, Mt. Jumbo, Mt. McGinnis, Thunder Mountain/Heintzleman Ridge** all these mountain trails are considered strenuous. These trails should not be tried alone or by the timid. Mt. Juneau Jumbo and McGinnis have various steep areas. All require stamina and care. Take lots of water and food. A guide is strongly recommended. Views are spectacular and worth the effort however.

**Mt. Juneau:** (Approx: 7 hours round trip) Access via Perseverance Trail. Approximate elevation gain is 3500 feet via switchback trails with a final steep challenge at the top. Enjoy panoramic views of Juneau and Gastineau Channel along the way with a sweeping vista of the entire channel from the Taku Inlet to Lynn Canal at the summit.

**Mt. Jumbo:** (Approx. 7 hours round trip) the trailhead is located off 5<sup>th</sup> street in Douglas. It is the highest mountain on the island at 3500 ft. The trail is well defined and in good shape. It begins gradually then steepens sharply. After climbing, the forest breaks and then you are in tundra rocks and in need of perseverance to continue on to the crowning views of Gastineau Channel and Stephens Passage and Icy Straits.

**Mt. McGinnis:** (Approx. 10-12 hours round trip) access at end of West Glacier Trail to the left. You must climb up the exposed granite areas to the top of the knoll. Cut along the

knoll toward the mountain and locate the path leading into the woods. From here the trail is well defined. Be sure to note where the trail starts and take compass points as you may miss the trail coming down.

The path goes up, across meadows, and up again. There are a few false summits, keep going, but stop and enjoy the spectacular views at every break. Above tree line, look for rock Cairns thoughtfully left as markers. Unlike many of the accessible mountains in the Juneau area, the top of McGinnis is fairly small. One gets a sense of real elevation and outstanding panoramic views of the Mendenhall Valley.

## **Beaches & Parks**

**Auke Recreation Area** is located off the new portion of Glacier Highway just past the Ferry Terminal. A local favorite for beach walks and barbeques. There are trails through the spruce forest, islands just offshore, resident harbor, porpoise, seabirds, and sea lions.

**Eagle Beach** is located at 30 mile Glacier Highway. It's a very scenic and sandy and home to many eagles. A great place for a picnic!

**Boy Scout Beach** is accessed off 27 mile Glacier Highway. Rich in history, 1 ½ mile easy trail follows Herbert River along remains of old corduroy road (poles laid next to each other perpendicular to trail to prevent miring in the mud), then runs through boggy meadow; further along you will find spectacular views of the Chilkat Range, Lynn Canal and Coastal Range.

**False Outer Point & Bluff Trail** at 11.4 mile North Douglas Highway, you'll find a trail head at the end of a large parking space overlooking the water. This trail will lead you gently down to the beach where picnicking, beach combing, and more trails await. Sea lions, sea ducks, gulls and all manner of inter-tidal beach life such as sea stars, urchins, snails, limpets, chi tons and more can be found. Follow the paths through the old forest or the beach at low tide to the beaches on the west side of False Outer Point.

## Wheelchair Accessible Trails in Juneau

**Mendenhall Glacier.** Many trails and viewing areas, as well as the Visitor Center, are easily accessed.

**Brotherhood Bridge Trail.** Located just north of the airport, the pathway and paved trail are approximately 2 ½ miles.

**Twin Lakes Recreation Area.** Located about 3 miles north of downtown, this paved trail skirts grassy hillsides and two small lakes.

## Visitor Parking in Downtown Juneau

### Street Parking

15 minutes and 1-hour parking areas are monitored year round. Parking fines are issued to drivers who ignore time limits. Streets outside the downtown core offer less-restricted parking.

**Caution:** Watch for signs indicating overnight, loading only and hourly limitations, for example, “No Parking between 2am and 6am, Mon-Fri” (different days for different streets).

After 6pm and on weekends the 1-hour limit for **on-street parking** is not in effect.

Downtown streets are narrow and many are one-way. Parking on the street in such a manner that impairs the view of other drivers, obstructs traffic flow, or is otherwise hazardous is prohibited.

### **Public Transportation**

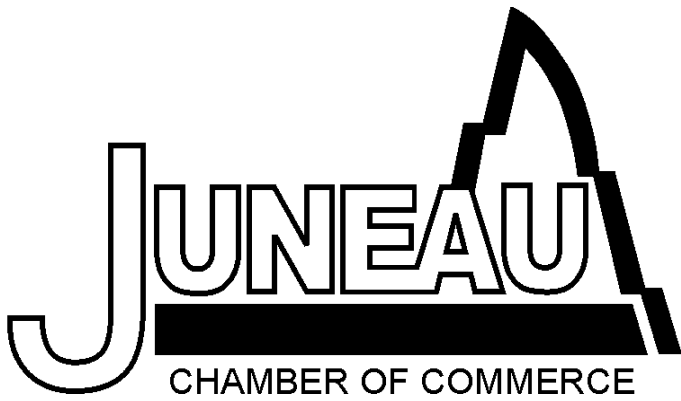

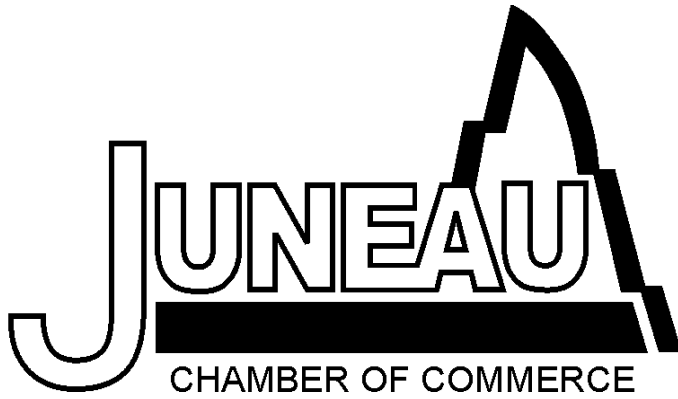

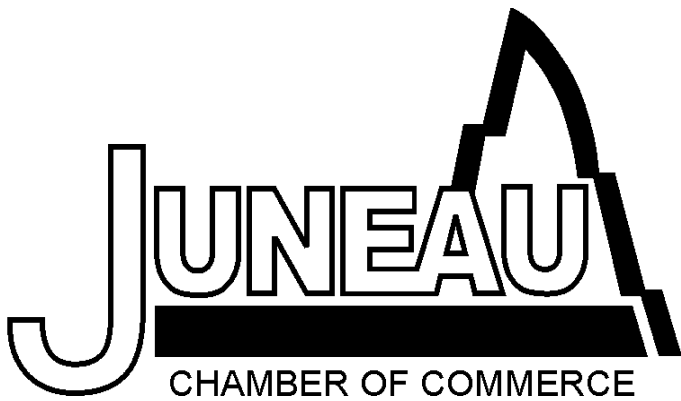
